> THE issue

The Fred Hollows Foundation is working to see a world where no one is needlessly blind or vision impaired. Right now, there are 1.1 billion people in the world who are blind or vision impaired. 90% of this vision loss can be treated or prevented.

> OUR response

The Fred Hollows Foundation has restored sight to more than 3 million people around the world. We work in over 25 countries including here in Australia in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities.

Examples of ways in which your staff could be further engaged:

- > **As little as \$25 can restore sight.**
- > **10 Employees (\$1,040 pa)**
Could fund the training of one basic eye doctor in Vietnam
- > **50 employees (\$5,200 pa)**
Could provide trachoma trichiasis surgery for up to 100 people in Ethiopia.
- > **100 employees (\$10,400)**
Could fund an entire Outreach Medical Eye Clinic in Nepal
- > Quarterly newsletters and regular updates on our program work.
- > Invitations to events such as, Fred's Big Run, Sydney Harbor Hike, and information sessions on our program work.
- > Volunteer opportunities and pro-bono support.

Examples assume each employee donated \$2 per week.

What we do

The Fred Hollows Foundation is an international development organisation working to restore sight to people who are needlessly blind or vision impaired.

We are inspired by the work of Professor Fred Hollows, an internationally acclaimed eye surgeon and an activist for social justice who championed the right of all people to have access to high quality and affordable eye care.

How we do it

We work to ensure no one is left behind and everyone has access to eye health care. We work to restore sight to people with eye conditions such as cataract, trachoma, and diabetic retinopathy.

We do this by:

- > Training our eye surgeons and health workers.
- > Screening patients for eye health conditions.
- > Building, renovating and equipping eye health facilities.
- > Advocating and influencing governments.
- > Developing technology and
- > Empowering people to access their right to eye care and good health.
